AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE FY 2019 CAPITAL BUDGET, STREETS AND CURBS.

**Whereas**, the Garrett Park Town Council has reviewed the revenues and expenditures in the Approved FY 2019 Operating and Capital Budget Accounts and the costs associated with the Street Repaving project and finds that changes to Capital Budget Account – Town Funds are required; and

**Whereas**, the Council has considered amendments to the budgets in light of its policy priorities; and

**Whereas**, the estimated cost of the Street Repaving project has risen above the available amount of unobligated Capital Budget Account – Town Funds in the line item 26.1 for Streets & Curbs in the FY 2019 Capital Budget; and

**Now therefore be it ordained and ordered**, that the Garrett Park Town Council approves the attached amendment to the FY 2019 Capital Budget as follows:

Capital Budget Account – Town Funds, Line Items 26.1, 26.2, and 28.2 – recognizes the transfer of \$60,000 from the Sidewalks line item 26.2 and \$20,000 from the Storm Drains line item 28.2 to the Streets & Curbs line item 26.1 to appropriate sufficient funds to cover potential increases in costs associated with the Street Repaving project.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE FY 2019 CAPITAL AND OPERATING BUDGETS, SAFE  
ROUTES TO SCHOOL

**Whereas**, the Garrett Park Town Council has reviewed the revenues and expenditures in the FY 2019 Capital and Operating Budgets adopted March 12, 2018, and the costs associated with the Safe Routes to School Sidewalk (SRTS) project and finds that changes to those Budgets are required; and

**Whereas**, the Council has considered amendments to the budgets in light of its policy priorities; and

**Whereas**, the estimated cost of this SRTS project has risen above the current State Highway Administration (SHA) grant award; and

**Whereas**, the Council recognizes the need to include changes to the FY 2019 Capital Budget Account – Financial Assistance by recognizing the availability of additional grant money from the SHA for the SRTS sidewalk project to cover 80% of the potential shortfall by providing this supplement as a 100% funded grant award; and

**Whereas**, the Council previously approved \$40,000 of Town funds to cover the Town's share of a potential shortfall and which still provides sufficient funding to cover 20% of the newly estimated remaining shortfall, as reflected in the Capital Budget Account – Town Funds, line item 26.3 SRTS Project;

**Now therefore be it ordained and ordered**, that the Garrett Park Town Council amends the attached Fiscal Year 2019 Capital and Operating Budgets as follows:

Revenue Budget Line Item 7.2 – SRTS SHA Grant Mod 2, recognizes the additional grant money being funded by SHA at 100%

Operating Budget Line Item 20.2.2 - Mod 2, under Transfers, recognizes the grant money being funded by SHA at 100% and transferred to the Capital Budget Account – Financial Assistance

Capital Budget Account – Financial Assistance Line Item 34.3 SRTS SHA Grant Mod 2 – recognizes the additional grant money being funded by SHA at 100%

**Be it further ordained and ordered,** that the Council adopts the above budget changes and allows the Mayor the discretion to move funds between the sub budget line items under Capital Budget Account – Town Funds 26.3, SRTS Project, provided that the Mayor shall inform the Council three days prior to taking such action with justification.

**Ordinance to Amend Chapter 5 of the Garrett Park Code:**  
**Single-Use Plastics**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING  
TO SINGLE-USE PLASTICS.**

**Whereas**, Maryland Code, Local Government Article, Section 5-202, as amended, grants to the legislative body of every incorporated municipality in Maryland general power to pass such ordinances not contrary to the Constitution of Maryland, or the public general law, as deemed necessary in order to assure the good government of the municipality, to protect and preserve the municipality's rights, property, and privileges, to preserve peace and good order, to secure persons and property from danger and destruction, and to protect the health, comfort and convenience of the citizens of the municipality;

**Whereas**, Section 78-17 of the Charter of the Town of Garrett Park authorizes the Town Council to pass ordinances not contrary to the Constitution and laws of the State of Maryland or the Charter as it may deem necessary for the good government of the Town; for the protection and preservation of the Town's property, rights and privileges; for the preservation of peace and good order; for securing persons and property from violence, danger or destruction; for the protection and promotion of the health, safety, comfort, convenience, welfare, and happiness of the residents and visitors in the Town and for such other police or health matters as it may deem necessary; and

**Whereas**, it is the responsibility of the Town of Garrett Park to provide for the health, welfare and quality of life of the residents of the town; and

**Whereas**, the Garrett Park Town Council endeavors to protect the natural environment of the town and its adjacent areas upon which activities within the Town may have an effect.

**Now, therefore, be it ordained and ordered**, this 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 2019, by the Garrett Park Town Council, acting under and by virtue of the authority given it by the Maryland Code and the Town of Garrett Park Charter, the Town Council does hereby adopt the foregoing Ordinance and amend the Garrett Park Town Code as follows:

**Section 504. Single-Use Plastics**

**(a) Straws:**

- (1) No restaurant, business, vendor, or special event organizer, shall sell, distribute, dispense, or otherwise provide a plastic straw, plastic stirrer, or plastic "splash stick," except at the request of a customer or attendee who requires such plastic implement to accommodate a disability.**

- (2) This prohibition does not apply to beverages with an attached straw, prepared and packaged outside the Town, provided such beverage is not altered, packaged or repackaged within the Town.
- (3) Straws which may be lawfully provided must be made of biodegradable material, such as paper or hay.
- (4) The definition of biodegradable shall be: made of material capable of being broken down into innocuous products by the action of living things (such as microorganisms) including being marine-degradable in water within a one-year period.

Violation of the Section is declared to be a municipal infraction. The penalty for each offense shall be \$100.00

**Be it further ordained and ordered**, by the Town Council, acting under and by virtue of the authority granted to it by the Maryland Code and the Town of Garrett Park Charter, that:

1. If any part or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the part or provision held to be invalid shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any remaining part thereof; and
2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March 2019.
